

Charlotte Memorial and Specially Dedicated Trees Planted Since 2000

- Millenium Tree. Swamp white oak planted with ceremony with State grant in June 2000 off SW corner of Town Hall.
- Memorial sugar maple tree from Katherine Teetor to honor husband Paul, at Barber Cemetery, in central portion near large stump (2006).
- Memorial swamp white oak from Alden and Andy Pellett to honor their sister Kerri Frost, at Town Beach Ballfield parking island (first of three trees going east on Lake Road-2007).
- Memorial sycamore from Sarah and Ted Montgomery to honor nephew Paul Rogers, at Town Beach Ballfield parking island (first of three trees going west on Lake Road-2007).
- Birthday tree for Richard Weed, a Princeton elm, from wife Joan, in front of Old Lantern (first tree north of driveway-2007). Died, 2015- replaced by a sycamore.
- Green-up Day sycamore funded by Charlotte Central School class bake sale, guided by Susanna Kahn, at Town Beach Park to provide future shade for parking lot attendant (2008).
- Memorial black locust from Christina Ellis for Marie-Dennet Murphy McBill at Charlotte Museum to replace large locust that was taken down in 2008 (2009).
- John Outwater Memorial Tree planted at Thompson's Point Ballfield, to provide shade, courtesy of Katherine Teetor (2009).
- Arbor Day apple tree planted at ceremony at The Old Lantern, on grounds south of building in 2009, followed by a party and tree display, organized by Robin Reid (tree obtained by her).
- Memorial sycamore tree at Town Beach Park beside bench overlooking Lake Champlain, to honor the late "Cowboy" Lewis, our Town Constable for many years (tree planted 2008, and dedicated in 2010).
- A 90th birthday tree of Freeman red maple for Robert Tucker (Thompson's Point summer resident), given by longtime friend Katherine Teetor. Planted on corner of Thompson's Point and Flat Rock Roads (2010).
- A 95th birthday tree given for Roberta Tucker Clair by Robert and Susan

Tucker. A sugar maple planted on Thompson's Point Road, second tree west of Flat Rock Road (2010).

A birthday-honoring tree for Dana Farley from many friends who donated generously, thus permitting the planting of several trees. Dana's tree is a sycamore at the Town Beach Ballpark parking island. Designated 2010, planted in 2008.

A memorial tree for Bodhi Kurindiyara Hill, designated by Carol Hanley and Bunky Bernstein, on Prindle Road, the farthest south of the planted row of red maples, -closest to their residence. 2010.

A row of 10 redXsilver maples planted in honor of Virginia Rutter, wife of William Rutter (and mother of Robin Coleburn) our initial and principal benefactor of the Rutter Family Charlotte Beautification Fund that made most of our roadside restoration tree project possible. Planted along Thompson's Point Road west of Flat Rock Road, beginning at tree number 3 (dedicated on 10/10/10 in a community tree planting event).

Two white pines were planted in October 2010 to the memory of John Outwater, donated by his wife Alice Outwater along Thompson's Point Road just east of Caretaker's dwelling.

At Barber Cemetery near southeast corner, a sugar maple was planted in October 2011 to honor Frank Thornton for his long service to the Town of Charlotte. Donated by Carrie MacKillop and Peter Demick.

Three swamp white oaks were planted in memory of Will Foster at the corner of Lake Road and Holmes Road in fall 2011, as a result of funds raised by wife Francis, and friends.

In spring 2012, at the Charlotte Library, a river birch was planted to express thanks for the long and faithful service to the Library Board of Trustees and Friends of the Library by Beth Merritt. Funds were raised by the Library staff and volunteers.

In spring 2012, a swamp white oak, a species much beloved by the late Sarah Montgomery, was planted along Greenbush Road opposite Ten Stones where she lived. Husband Ted and neighbors contributed to this memorial tree, and have committed to its care.

A memorial swamp white oak planted May, 2015 on center island at entrance to Charlotte Park and Wildlife Reserve for Arline Lewis who was often "gatekeeper" at the Park with husband "Cowboy" Lewis. From the family.

A "Tree Warden swamp white oak" planted to honor 90th birthday and 20-year service of Larry Hamilton in June, 2015. To provide shade to overview bench in upper Charlotte Park and Wildlife Refuge, Unit B.
